

20 April 2016**ASX ANNOUNCEMENT****LITCC CONVERSIONS CONTINUE and DIRECTORS EXERCISE OPTIONS**

Lithium Australia NL (LIT) advises that it has issued 3.75m shares as a result of two directors exercising their 15 cent options, to raise a further \$562,500. The relevant Appendix 3Ys are attached.
